Update from Pastor Mark

This past Sunday we had our annual Thanksgiving service, during which our congregation expressed gratitude and gave thanks for all that God has been doing in our lives. As person after person rose to share how God has blessed them this year, I was struck by what a testimony this is to the goodness and faithfulness of God. Through the ups and the downs, the victories and the challenges, the still waters and the trials – Christ has shepherded Grace Presbyterian Church with great faithfulness and love.

One thing I keep reminding myself is that God has established our church, at this very time and place, so that the 40,000 plus people who call the Hamptons their home (plus the 250,000+ who spend time out here each year) may hear the good news of God and turn and find life in Christ. The Hamptons is a very spiritually dry place – as is all of Long Island. But God is using us to make an eternal difference in many people lives. It is my firm belief that, as a church, we are just getting started.

One thing that has me excited for our community is the large number of people attending our Evangelism Workshop. The people of Grace Church want to know how they can better reach our neighbors on the East End as their hearts are growing to be more like our heavenly Father’s heart, which loves his creatures made in his image. They are learning to understand our culture and how scripture teaches us to evangelize our neighbors, and they are gaining practical skills that will give them confidence to share the gospel. I am excited for the fruit that their labors will bring, and I ask that you would pray for many to come to faith through their loving commitment to share the gospel.

As 2016 is ending we are looking to

build upon the foundation God has established. In April of 2017 we will celebrate ten years of worshipping as a church – ten years of God’s establishing a worshipping community on the far East End of Long Island. Now we are looking to the next ten years and beyond. Our focus as a church must now shift from making sure we are established to becoming a greater force for the advancement of the gospel, in the Hamptons but also throughout Long Island and the world.

With this in mind, I would like to share that we are now beginning in earnest to fulfill two of our long-established vision goals. One is to plant other churches throughout Long Island. And the other is to establish a Christian counseling center on the East End. We estimate that perhaps as little as 3% of Long Islanders are alive in the gospel. We hope to change this, one new church at a time. In 2017 we begin in earnest to plant our first church! We also begin in earnest to work towards opening a counseling center on the East End! The need is great as there is no referable Christian counseling center within sixty miles!

These are important and worthy projects for our church to begin to undertake. So, I ask that you would pray for us as we plan and prepare. These initiatives will require resources that will stretch our small church. The leadership needed for both these endeavors will stretch us thin, so pray for effective leadership. And we are stretching ourselves financially. So please pray that God would continue to cause us to be cheerful and generous givers. And please pray that we would finish this year on a solid financial footing and therefore be better equipped to enter

Evangelism Workshop

When most people hear the word “evangelism,” they pretend they didn’t hear it and run the opposite direction!
