## A Letter from Pastor Mark Middlekauff

At Christmas there is always one thing or another pulling on our hearts. And often it's really good things like spending quality AND quantity time with family or serving others in our communities, like our church's annual Christmas Carol Bingo at the Hamptons Center retirement home.

And yet, our hearts can be pulled in other directions, too - and it's easy to see why! With all the "Christmas" ads and their tempting words like, "The Holidays are the perfect time for that new car! In fact, how about his and her SUV's in matching colors!"

Now it's probably true that most of us could use a new car (or two). And we all have genuine needs in order to live Godhonoring lives (that's why I always seem to get new socks at Christmas; might as well, right?). But may we be reminded this Christmas season of how easy it is for our hearts to be pulled in the wrong direction. Now, I need this reminder just as much as ... well ... Jesus' disciples!

Here is what Jesus says: "Do not lay up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust destroy and where thieves break in and steal, but lay up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust destroys and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:19-21).

Amazing! Jesus is saying we only have two options for what pulls on our hearts: If we treasure earthly, vulnerable, breakable stuff, our hearts will not only be pulled towards stuff, but our hearts will, in the end, be what's broken! But when we treasure Christ and his kingdom, our hearts will be pulled towards that which is eternally valuable, and therefore **our hearts will be satisfied**; both now and in the age to come.

This Advent season is a time for us to be reminded where our greatest treasure is, so that our hearts may be pulled towards Christ and his kingdom. And as we do this, by God's grace, the joy and peace of Christ comes to us. May this be your experience this Advent season. May the gospel of Christ be your treasure, and may this treasure pull you in!
